

- Implement legislation to reduce and eliminate plastics and waste from being dumped into our waters. (*NSDP Goal 6*)

Highlights of our ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The cries have not gone on deaf ears. Team VIP continued to stay close to our people to ensure a greater understanding of the issues and have responded in the House of Assembly, in the Government and on the ground. In this section, we present some highlights of the work we have done in the last four years in service to the people of the Virgin Islands.





Good Governance

he Virgin Islands Party was the driving force behind a number of key governance initiatives that were long overdue and which are critical for advancing the political, economic and social development of the Virgin Islands. We did this in the midst of many multi-layered challenges, and set the bar for performance in Government.

THESE INCLUDED

- Introducing and passing over 100 pieces of legislation in the House of Assembly; for example - the Whistle Blower Act, Amendments to the Register of Interests Act, the Contractor General Act, the Public Procurement Act, and more.
- Initiating the appointment of a

Constitutional Review Commission with strong representation from the Sister Islands, to begin the long-overdue Constitutional Review process.

• Commencing the implementation of the recommendations of the Commission of Inquiry. Forty-nine per cent (49%) of action



items are completed, and eighteen per cent (18%) are in progress and on track. A further seventeen per cent (17%) are also underway while the other fourteen per cent (14%) have not reached the time scheduled for commencement.

- Passing five national budgets and staying within the Protocols for Effective Financial Management.
- Commissioning, completing, and approving the National Sustainable Development Plan as a road map for the development of the Virgin Islands up to 2036. This was done in partnership with the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC).

- Conducting Cabinet Meetings for the first time on the sister islands of Jost Van Dyke. Virgin Gorda and Anegada to bring governance processes closer to the people.
- Introducing Ministers' office hours without an appointment every Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in February 2022 so citizens could meet regularly with their representatives.
- Signing the United Nation Multi-Country Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework for the Caribbean 2022-2026.
- Establishing Constituency Offices to improve access by citizens to their Representatives.
- Re-introducing the Virgin Islands Youth Parliament to prepare the next generation of Virgin Islands' leaders.
- 11.Conducting public consultations on several major initiatives
- We also conducted public consultations on a number of major initiatives, and re-introduced the Virgin Islands Youth Parliament prepare our young people for leading their country in the future. We introduced Ministers' office hours without an appointment on every Tuesday, Thursday and Friday in February 2022 for citizens to discuss any long-standing issue or problem they may have with their representatives.



The Economy

he global economy was a roller coaster over the last four years due to the economic impacts of the pandemic and the Russia-Ukraine conflict. This could have caused catastrophic damage to the Virgin Islands' economy, especially coming during our recovery from the 2017 hurricanes. The Virgin Islands Party Government took decisive action to protect the economy, support small businesses, and helped our people to navigate these tumultuous times.

MEASURES UNDERTAKEN INCLUDED

- Re-engaging our tourism stakeholders in 2019, especially in the cruise sub-sector to re-energize the tourism industry which had been at a near standstill since the hurricanes of 2017.
- Supporting financial services sector initiatives to diversify our product range to attract new businesses and offer new services.
- Providing financial support to small and medium-sized businesses during the COVID-19 pandemic (across the Virgin

Islands) to help them survive the economic impacts of the crisis, remain gainfully employed and prevent catastrophic damage to the local economy.

 Providing further support to tourism-related businesses such as hotels, restaurants and taxi and tour operators. Becoming Gold Seal certified, through partnership with H. Lavity Stoutt Community College and the BVI Tourist Board, ensured they could and operate safely during the pandemic while earning an income. This kept the wheels of the economy turning.



- Capping import duties to a maximum of 5%, cutting import duties on fuel by 50% and subsidizing the fuel oil charge on electricity to cushion the economic impacts of COVID-19 and the Russia-Ukraine conflict on residents.
- We passed Consumer Protection legislation and legislation to establish the Trade Commission
- Passing legislation allowing non-Belonger homeowners to spend up to 10 months in the Territory.
- Passing the Virgin Islands Gaming and Betting Control (Amendment) Act, 2021.
- Extending the Caribbean Catastrophe Risk Insurance Facility from \$15M to \$53M coverage for the BVI.
- We paid increments to public officers and put measures in place to assure outstanding increments are paid.

- Passing legislation to improve the coverage of Depositors' Insurance to protect persons' savings in banks.
- Passing a suite of Financial Action Task Force legislation to protect the economy and meet international requirements and standards.
- Introducing and commencing the implementation of the Registration Apprenticeship Training Employment and Development (RATED) Programme to address unemployment and underemployment in the Territory and to also develop the skills of Virgin Islanders to make them more marketable in the labour market.
- Commencing the Public Service Salary Review and Job Classification Review.
- Modernizing the Liquor Licenses Act
- Implementing the money services transaction levy.

Tourism, Culture & Heritage

he renewed identity/heritage of our people being high on our agenda was the catalyst for supporting infrastructure which placed focus on culture, which is essential for nation-building and contributes to the uniqueness of our tourism product. The Virgin Islands Party Government worked closely with our tourism stakeholders and ensured a quick recovery of our industry.







THE VIRGIN ISLANDS PARTY GOVERNMENT

- Funded the Gold Seal Certification for Businesses in the Tourism Sector to facilitate the early and safe reopening of our tourism industry during the COVID-19 Pandemic.
- Signed an agreement to make the Virgin Islands a Presidential Partner of the Florida-Caribbean Cruise Association (FCCA) to increase cruise calls and overnight businesses for our tourism sector.
- Amended the "Cruising Permit" and "Home Porting" Acts to ensure increased economic opportunities for the Virgin Islands flagged vessels; safety and compliance with international obligations.
- Welcomed Saga Cruise Line's Spirit of Discovery and Holland America's Rotterdam as they made their inaugural cruise calls to the Territory.
- Opened temporary Ports facilities at West End Ferry Dock.
- Constructed the Dog Hole Terminal Building on Jost Van Dyke via the BVI Ports Authority
- Passed Public Holidays (Amendment) Act, 2021.
- Unveiled the 6ft 'BVI' Welcome Sign and the Cyril B. Romney Statue at the Cyril B. Romney Tortola Pier Park on its 6th Anniversary.
- Restored Sir Olva Georges statue, damaged

in the 2017 hurricanes.

- Approved the Culture and Heritage Policy and Strategy.
- Conducted the Territory-wide Cultural/ Tourism Christmas Extravaganza through the Office of the Premier, and the Annual Premier's Christmas Carols on Wheels.
- Restored the statue of national hero, Noel Lloyd.
- Celebrated the first ever 1949 Great March and Restoration holiday.
- Sponsored the first-ever BVI Lit Fest.
- Revived the Fungi Fest.
- Celebrated Heroes and Fore-Parents Holiday.
- Replaced Territory Day with Virgin Islands Day.
- Changed the song to be played at medal ceremonies from God Save the Queen to the Territorial Song, Oh Beautiful Virgin Islands.
- Introduced Culture and Tourism Month.
- Introduced the first-ever Caribbean Unity Weekend.
- Approved the 60th Anniversary Red Cross license plate.

he Virgin Islands Party Government recognizes the importance of aviation and marine services to our people and our critical industries. As such, we placed immense focus on these areas, including:

- Commencing the process of having direct flights to Terrance B. Lettsome International Airport, from Mainland USA. American Airlines direct flights to Miami commences on 1 June 2023.
- Initiating and advancing dialogue with other international and regional airlines to add the Virgin Islands to their route network.
- Resuming international commercial flights at Taddy Bay International Airport in Virgin Gorda; and commencing international and night flights at the Auguste George International Airport in Anegada.
- Constructing a new Welcome Centre at Terrance.B. Lettsome International Airport to facilitate air arrivals during the COVID-19 Pandemic.
- Constructing a new Welcome Center at the Taddy Bay International Airport, Virgin Gorda, which will serve as part of the new Arrivals Area for the airport.
- Paving the access road to the Taddy Bay

International Airport, VG - for the first time in over 40 years.

- Commencing technical work for the expansion of Terrance. B. Lettsome International Airport.
- Re-establishing the Department of Civil Aviation.
- Upgrading the Ports Management System
- Commissioning the BVI Ports Authority Harbour Patrol boat.
- Continuing the Marine Programme at HLSCC; including supporting Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers (STCW) certification from the HLSCC Maritime Program for Mariners.
- Amending the "Cruising Permit" and "Home Porting" Acts to ensure increased economic opportunities for BVI flagged vessels and to ensure safety and compliance with international obligations.
- The launch of HM Customs Vessel, Searcher.
- Opening temporary Ports facilities at the West End Ferry Dock.
- Constructing the Dog Hole Terminal Building on Jost Van Dyke by BVI Ports Authority.





Financial Services


he BVI's Financial Services Industry is of critical importance to the government and economy of the Virgin Islands. As one of the economy's two primary economic engines, the sector is the largest contributor to government revenues at more than 60%. During the COVID-19 pandemic, financial services was the mainstay of the Territory's economy as tourism and international travel were brought to a halt due to the deterioration of public health conditions worldwide.

Under the leadership and direction the Virgin Islands Party, the Government took strategic action to ensure that the industry remained open for business, servicing clients globally, while other offshore jurisdictions had only limited functionality. Swift and concerted action ensured that the Territory had steady stream of income to support its people and finance the Government's international and local obligations.

BETWEEN 2019 AND 2023 THE VIRGIN ISLANDS PARTY GOVERNMENT

- Took prompt and decisive steps to ensure the BVI's Financial Services Industry remained Open for Business during the COVID-19 Pandemic. Implementing measures for lawyers to become BVI qualified remotely, allowing digital/online and remote board and shareholder meetings outside the Territory, and providing for remote and online court proceedings.
- Took strategic actions driving an increase in business company volumes, revenues, and post-incorporation business between mid-2020 and March 2023. Annual Financial Services Revenues in the period surpassed that of the previous Government, climaxing in 2021 with an average monthly increase in incorporations of 500-700 above 2017-2018 figures.





- Increased the overall value of BVI Business Companies and funds by increasing fees and post-incorporation work.
- Successfully completed the post-hurricane transition of BVI's courts back to the Territory into refurbished offices and court rooms to service the industry.
- Strengthened the overall legislative framework for the operation of the industry and to meet the requirements of international institutions including the Financial Action Task Force and International Monetary Fund.
- Successfully implemented an Economic Substance Regime (legislation), meeting European Union requirements, while requiring Financial Services Firms & Companies to make greater investments in the local economy and employment.



Agriculture & Fisheries

uring the last term in office, the Virgin Islands Party Government provided immense support to our farmers, fishermen and food producers, increasing the availability of locally produced food on the market.

THE VIRGIN ISLANDS PARTY GOVERNMENT

- Passed the Virgin Islands Food and Sustainability Act, 2022.
- Established a management committee for the land at Paraquita Bay that has been designated for agricultural purposes.
- Leased a parcel of land to a local company to increase local chicken production.
- Exempted Customs duty for steel building material and poultry equipment as we encouraged the production of poultry in enhancing food security.

- Signed an MOU with the UK government department to conduct research and provide support for more effective fisheries management.
- Launched Agricultural Training Courses at the H. Lavity Stoutt Community College.
- Reintroduced the annual Agricultural Fair.
- Allocated 40 acres of land on Anegada for farming.





Public Services

ncreasing the efficiency of public service and access to Government services has been a top priority of the Virgin Islands Party Government. Our most valuable assets were disenfranchised during the hurricanes, which destroyed many government offices, furniture and equipment. Cost of living raises were neglected and our citizens were feeling the pinch. The Virgin Islands Party Government supported initiatives to advance the process of improving the terms and conditions of public officers, among other measures.

THE VIRGIN ISLANDS PARTY GOVERNMENT

- Ensured the payment of increments owed to public officers for 7 years, two with arrears. Increments for 2016, 2017 and 2018 were paid. Increments for 2018 and 2019 were approved to be paid with arrears. For 2020, 2021 and 2022 the steps have been moved up and Cabinet has approved the payment of the remaining increments and the money was budgeted and approved in the 2023 Budget.
- Initiated and approved the ongoing Public Service Salary Review and Job Re-classification exercise
- Passed the E-Government suite of legislation, presently being implemented,
- Made provisions for the extension of office hours at the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Property, Land Ownership and Affordable Housing

Over the past four years, the Virgin Islands Government initiated a number of measures to empower Virgin Islanders in land ownership and to secure their interests.

- Passing the Stamp (Amendment) Act, 2022 to allow Belongers who are first time land and property owners by sale or transfer to be exempted from paying stamp duty.
- A one-year amnesty to remove the interest on the late fees owed for Property Tax.
- Approval of the establishment of the Salt Island Lands Advisory Body in keeping with the Government's agenda of empowerment

of our people through land and home ownership.

- Commencement of measures to resolve the Anegada land matter.
- Construction of several social homes to bring relief to families whose homes were damaged or destroyed by the 2017 hurricanes under the Housing Recovery Assistance Programme.







Education & Training

hen the Virgin Islands Party assumed political office in 2019, our scholastic infrastructure was in a dire state of disrepair. Our children were being housed in accommodations not befitting a school, scattered in multiple locations. The Virgin Islands Party immediately moved to remedy the situation. We also provided resources to support several training and development programmes to equip our youths for productive lives.

ike no other time in the last 100 years, health infrastructure, systems and services took centre stage in the worst pandemic to rock the world in modern time – the COVID-19 Global Pandemic.

The Virgin Islands Party Government upgraded the facilities and the lab at the Dr. D. Orlando Smith Hospital to meet the COVID-19 challenge. We repaired and upgraded community health centres, and increased services. We also made strides in improving public health.

OUR WORK INCLUDED

- Completing, opening and equipping the Nurse Iris O'Neal Medical Center in Virgin Gorda with state of the art dental equipment, lab equipment, ultrasound machinery, and X-Ray imaging equipment.
- Resumption of regular healthcare services at the North Sound clinic on Mondays and Fridays for Wound Care, Doctor's Clinic (ambulatory and chronic disease), and Blood Pressure checks.
- Securing accreditation of the Dr. D. Orlando Smith Hospital from the international accrediting body, DNVL Det Norske Veritas (Norway) and Germanischer Lloyd (Germany).



- Training personnel and certifying the Dr. D. Orlando Smith Hospital Laboratory to deliver 75,000 COVID-19 tests and counting.
- Developing a Specialist Clinic/Pandemic Readied Negative Pressure Unit
- Expanding the Road Town Community Clinic
- Expanding and outfitting the Clinical Laboratory which is now ISO 15189 ready.
- Purchasing a "40 Bed Field Hospital" for accommodation of hospital overflows and for periods of natural disasters.
- Securing the assistance of Cuban doctors to deliver medical services.
- Negotiating emergency airlift services from Anegada via Caribbean Buzz.
- Roll out of the COVID-19 vaccination programme for residents who wanted to take the vaccine.
 60.1% of population vaccinated.
- Purchasing the Hummingbird System to capture vaccination and immunization data at testing facilities and ports of entry.
- Passing the Medical Act 2020 and the Nurses and Midwife Act 2021 in the House of Assembly.
- Removing over 6,000 derelict vehicles from the Territory since 2019.
- Awarding contracts Territory-wide through the tender process for solid waste collection including bulk waste collection.











Social Support and Social Development

Before the assumption of political office in 2019, many families were experiencing displacement or severe discomfort via damage to their homes by the 2017 hurricanes. Many were also struggling to make ends meet as the COVID-19 pandemic followed shortly. Since then, the Virgin Islands Party moved steadfastly to alleviate the problems and bring relief, as promised, to the vulnerable.

SOME OF OUR MEASURES INCLUDED

- A \$15 million housing repairs allotment was repurposed to allow more people to receive assistance.
- Ten-million-dollar of the \$40 million Social Security Grant was allocated to the housing repairs program.
- A 15-member evaluation committee was established to evaluate and approve each application for housing assistance, to which:
- 22 social homes were constructed across, Anegada, Virgin Gorda, Jost Van Dyke and Tortola.

- Eight Home Rebuild Grants, a maximum of up to \$150,000 maximum each, were issued,
- 177 Home Repair Grants, a maximum of up to \$100,000 maximum each, were issued,
- 200 Materials Grant up to \$10,000 each were issued,
- 60 Appliance & Hurricane Shutters Grants were issued.
- Completion of the Jose Hill Manor housing project.
- Making stimulus available to families and businesses during COVID-19.



Infrastructure

Iot of our public infrastructure was in a state of neglect and disrepair even before the 2017 hurricanes. The problem was exacerbated by the hurricanes and the recovery efforts thereafter were moving at a snail's pace until the Virgin Islands Party entered office in 2019. Notwithstanding economic challenges and disruptions from COVID-19, the Virgin Islands Party Government moved with pace to repair, restore, and upgrade infrastructure throughout the Territory, including unprecedented levels of work on our Sister Islands.





Our Proposals

hile we have accomplished a lot in the last four years across every sector, the Virgin Islands Party acknowledges there is room for improvement and work needs to continue in advancing the Territory's development – especially considering the time and resources lost to COVID-19 and other issues beyond the Territory's control. The important work we started and earmarked must continue. We must build on the foundation laid in the last term. This work includes implementing the National Sustainable Development Plan, the Virgin Islands Culture and Heritage Policy and Strategy, the Blue Economy Roadmap, Constitutional Reform, the Government Reform programme, expansion of our water distribution network, advancing food security, and much more.

In this section, we highlight some of the major initiatives that the Virgin Islands Party will prioritise once re-elected.



Good Governance

Officials must demonstrate honesty and integrity as they gain office on public trust. They must transparently conduct their duties and be accountable for their actions, both to the people and the laws of the land. he Virgin Islands Party believes in Accountable Government and Citizen Participation. The fundamental principle of Good Governance is rooted in democracy, where residents participate in the governmental process.

An effective and functioning government is supported by strong institutions and systems. They ensure that the public's interests are protected and served and that checks and balances are in place to rein in the exercise of power and authority.

Elected Officials must demonstrate honesty and integrity as they gain office on public trust. They must transparently conduct their duties and be accountable for their actions, both to the people and the laws of the land. In addition, they must show respect to the people whom they represent. These officials must work to advance the aspirations of the Virgin Islands people and honour the purpose of their office. In our next term in office, a Virgin Islands Party Government will continue the good work that was started. We will:

- Complete the Constitutional Review process, ensuring that the new Constitution embodies and advances the aspirations of the Virgin Islands people.
- Further strengthen the Good Governance framework to include such things as the implementing the Human Rights Commission, passing the Freedom of Information Act, and additional changes to the register of Interests Act.
- Implement the National Sustainable Development Plan, mapping the Sustainable Development Goals to departmental policies.
- Complete implementation of the recommendations of the Commission of Inquiry, and ensure that our Constitution is

not suspended by the United Kingdom's reserve Order in Council.

- Put in place an appropriate system of risk oversight and internal controls undertaken by a Risk Management Team.
- Complete the work with the United Nation's Committee on Decolonization.
- Strengthen the capacities of public policy and rule of law institutions and civil society organizations.
- Establish District Councils in all nine Districts to further involve residents in the development of their communities.
- Continue reporting to the people on the work of the Government through regular press conferences.

The Economy

top priority of the Virgin Islands Party has been to ensure that the Virgin Islands has a prosperous, vibrant, economy that is competitive and thriving internationally.

A strong economy must have its foundation in prudent fiscal management. This safeguards institutions that deliver good governance, draw international investor confidence, and builds the trust of the people in the government. It is important for a stable economy that is positioned to achieve economic growth, and which creates employment and wealth generation. A Virgin Islands Party government will manage the financial affairs of the Virgin Islands in a fiscally sound and prudent manner.

We will continue to provide responsible and innovative management of the Virgin Islands' economy so that it continues to grow, provide opportunities for our people, and improve the quality of life for all our residents.

Responsible Fiscal Management

In order to deliver effective and responsible fiscal management, a Virgin Islands Party Government will:

- Manage the finances of the Virgin Islands in compliance with the Virgin Islands Constitution, the Protocols for Effective Financial Management, the Finance and Management Act and all legal, policy and procedural instruments in force in the Territory.
- Complete all outstanding audits by 2024 and comply with requirements for completion of all future audits.

- Ensure that expenditures are kept in line with revenues, and ensure that the debt of the Territory remains in compliance with acceptable international standards and those agreed by government.
- Enforce and strengthen measures to control spending of public money and ensure value for money by reinstituting proper use of the J.D. Edwards system.
- Ensure proper due diligence is carried out for all major projects by using the "new initiative process" in the budgetary exercise.

Management of the Economy

In the upcoming term, a Virgin Islands Party Government will continue to drive economic diversification and growth. We will:

- Initiate the credit rating process to get a credible rating from Moody's and Standard and Poors.
- Engage with the Private Sector on Government Priorities and the linkages with corporate social and economic responsibilities.
- Undertake executive capacity building in results-based management, customer service and risk management throughout the public service and with elected representative
- Attract new tourism investments.
- Attract international companies on our register to have a physical presence in the Virgin Islands.
- Continue the development and expansion of the RATED Programme to alleviate unemployment and contribute to youth development.
- Attract investment in sports infrastructure.
- Attract investment in conference facilities to position the Virgin Islands as the ideal location for conferences, seminars, training and similar activities.

- Review the laws and policies to ensure a visitor-friendly marine sector
- Develop partnerships that will bolster sports fishing.
- Upgrade the digital space through negotiation of new contracts with service providers
- Upgrade capacity building in negotiations, business law and protocol
- Promote a business-friendly environment through Public Financial Management Transformation
- Establish an incubator system for new businesses
- Facilitate the establishment of light manufacturing and innovation industries
- Consolidate the linkages between Tourism, Agriculture and Fishing
- Improve the efficiency and competitiveness of traditional industries
- Accelerate the diversification of the economy by creating new industries in partnership with the private sector.

- Establish an investment policy for nationals
- Establish a suite of incentives for Virgin Islanders living abroad to return home and open or invest in businesses.

Additionally, inter-island travel is critical to the Virgin Islands' economy as well as maintaining cultural and

social ties.

During the last term, the Virgin Islands Party-led Government has focused on collaborating with our partners in the international and regional air services industry and other stakeholders at home and abroad to promote route development, enhance the services available at our airports and improve the traveller experience.

A Virgin Islands Party Government will:


- Expand the runway and terminal at the Terrance B. Lettsome International Airport.

- Support and encourage the construction of additional marinas.











Financial Services

- Make the jurisdiction more friendly for attracting new businesses and offering more services to clients.
- Expand and Diversify the BVI's Primary Financial Services Markets. Presently the BVI's primary and largest Financial Services Markets are China & East Asia, Latin America, and the United Kingdom. However, in the 2020-30's the highest economic growth countries and regions will be India, Indonesia, ASEAN, and the Middle East. Such markets will continue to feed the high-volume low-midrange cost model of BVI's Financial Services Industry for some 20 years. BVI must diversify its markets into these regions to secure the long-term profitability and growth of its Financial Services.
- Complete the transition of the BVI's to a fullservice Fintech & Digital Assets Jurisdiction. Having passed the BVI's VASP Legislation, as well as provision of its Digital Sandbox, the BVI must push to become a Fintech financial services Global Power house in similarity to its dominant position in offshore company incorporations.
- Fully digitize Government institutions servicing Financial Services including Trade, the Courts (Registrar), Immigration, FSC, and Deputy Governor's Office.
- Provide Notarial, Apostille and Attestation Services in BVI's Hong Kong and London Representative Offices. The first international expansion of BVI's Financial Services was the opening of the Financial Services





Commission Representative Office in Hong Kong for the real-time issuing of Certificates in the Asia-Pacific. The next stage in the expansion of BVI's government based Financial Services institutions is the provision of public notary, apostille, and attestation services internationally within BVI's primary Markets in Asia, Latin America, UK, and Middle East via BVI's representative offices. The external provision of these services also serves as a security where in the event of a future catastrophic natural disaster, the Financial Services industry can continue to function beyond BVI's shores.

 Open a BVI Representative Office in Panama to service the Latin America segment of BVI's Financial Services Industry. Latin America is the Territory's second largest financial services market, and the office would serve to represent BVI's interests from Mexico to Central-South America. The localized issuing of certificates, provision of notary-apostille-attestation services would significantly expand the amount of BVI business done in the region, through servicing clients in real-time.

Agriculture and Fisheries

In the past, Agriculture and Fisheries played a vital part in the Virgin Islands' economy, and it continues to have their role in bolstering the Territory's economy. Advancement in local food production is important as it creates an avenue for job creation. Food security in the Virgin Islands includes our ability to ensure an adequate supply of affordable, nutritious food, especially during times when there are shortages of

- Establish the Virgin Islands Agriculture and Fisheries Authority which will assist farmers and fisherfolk with accessing financial assistance, grants, loan funding and other necessities for production.
- Initiate the Agriculture and Food Production Initiative under the RATED Programme, providing opportunities for gainful employment for our people.
- Build the Agriculture and Fisheries Complex at Paraquita Bay.
- Build fish landing sites on Tortola, Virgin Gorda and Jost van Dyke.
- Make Anegada the breadbasket of the Virgin Islands by constructing a fish processing facility, greenhouses, and poultry houses on Anegada
- Allocate additional land for agriculture and

imported food and during periods when prices of imported food increase because of international factors such as fuel prices, shortage, and shipping issues.

Public Services

The Virgin Islands Party believes that our public officers must have a comfortable and safe place to work, and deserve terms and conditions that are commensurate with their role in this regard.

- Complete the Public Service Salary Review and Job Classification Review.
- Continue the implementation of e-Government services.
- Complete payment of increments owed to public officers. The Decision is approved by Cabinet and the money is budgeted.
- Invest in training and development for our public officers.
- Complete restoration of the Ralph T. O'Neal Administration Complex.

Property, Land Ownership and Affordable Housing

For Virgin Islanders, our lands are the treasure under our feet. This was recognized by our fore-parents when they grabbed the opportunity to purchase the then-encumbered estates in the 1800s and took other measures to protect our interests in the land. They recognize then, as we do now, that it is important for the sustainability of our people that they can own land for housing, food production and business, and to be able to pass on land to future generations.

In the upcoming four years, a Virgin Islands Party Government will:

- Extend the package of incentives to assist Belongers with purchasing land, especially for home ownership and first-time homeowners.
- Move forward with the establishment of a land bank.
- Establish an affordable housing programme in every community through a partnership between the Government, developers, financial institutions, and prospective homeowners.

Crime, Policing and Border Protection

rime is a serious concern for the Virgin Islands Party, as it indeed is for all our residents. A Virgin Islands Party Government will continue to play our role, especially those that are enshrined in the Constitution, to support law enforcement in the fight against crime.

We will:

- Execute a border management plan inclusive of using radars and drones.
- Provide additional resources to the police for law enforcement.
- Reform and modernize the law enforcement infrastructure.
- Improve the Juvenile Justice Programme.

- Launch an innovation competition for youth in environmental sustainability.




Sister Islands

For many years he was at the centre of local efforts to highlight Virgin Islands social and political history, which have included his performance in the documentary "A Patriotic Man", in which he portrayed Virgin Islands National Hero, the late Noel Lloyd, as well as the live re-enactment of the "Great March of 1949", in which he played another Virgin Islands National Hero, the late Hon. Theodolph Faulkner.

Hon. Wheatley holds a Doctorate of Philosophy from the University of London's School of Oriental and African Studies (SOAS), Master's degree in Literary Studies from Purdue University (Magna Cum Laude), Bachelor's degree in English from Clark Atlanta University (Magna Cum Laude), and is a 1996 graduate of the BVI High School in (Honours).

Among his accolades are becoming a Mellon Mays Fellow, winning an internship at the Institute for the Recruitment of Teachers, earning the prestigious Commonwealth Scholarship for doctoral studies, receiving the first Lecturer of the Month award at HLSCC, and being elected to President of the Virgin Islands Party (VIP) in 2016 and Chairman of the VIP in 2023. In his roles as Premier, Deputy Premier and Minister, he has represented the Virgin Islands in numerous regional and international forums that have included the United Nations (UN), CARICOM, OECS, UKOTA and Caribbean Overseas Territories Caucus. Over the past 10 months he has led negotiations and engagement with the United Kingdom (UK).

Hon. Wheatley is the son of Douglas Wheatley and Medita Malone Wheatley and is the fifth of eight siblings. His paternal grandparents are Dr. Willard Wheatley LLD and Dorothy Davies. His maternal grandparents are Gad Stanley Malone and Perpote Thomas Malone.

Once equity is in the property, funds will be repaid back into the account for another first-time homeowner. Eg. \$30,000 is 5% of a \$600,000 home. \$1.5M allocated means 50 potential homeowners annually (5 per District).
- Review to increase public assistance grant taking into consideration the cost of living; and the strengthening of the policy that allows the Virgin Islands to seize assets of those persons that become a ward of the State, which will finance their care.



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
